Security guards announce new tenday strike

PCS members to take action weeks commencing August 12 and 26

Hundreds of Public and Commercial Services (PCS) union members employed by G4S at the DWP have announced a new ten-day strike.

The JobCentre security guards, who yesterday began a week-long strike in the same, long-running pay dispute, will also walk out alongside colleagues in the GMB union on weeks commencing August 12 and 26.

PCS general secretary Fran Heathcote said: ""Our members risk their own safety to keep DWP staff and the public safe.

"They deserve to be paid a decent wage. It is wrong that G4S refuse to pay this, particularly while taxpayers are funding their profits. They are a huge multinational company with substantial assets yet they are paying the minimum wage to their workers.

"It's time they gave our members the pay and terms and conditions they deserve."
